

Full Speed Ahead—2013 Projects Begin in the Watershed

It has been a busy year here in Raccoon Creek. The Water Quality Specialist Position is a grant funded joint venture between multiple partners and we are pleased to report that the position has been funded for another two years. Yeay! - Now, back to business. Chemical water quality monitoring has continued with nearly 400 water

samples taken in the watershed since January! Water samples are collected to measure the performance of our projects before and after construction and we have long term monitoring locations spanning all six

counties! The biological monitoring season for Raccoon Creek begins in July and runs til October 15th. During this time we collect macroinvertebrates and sample fish. So far in 2013 we have collected macroinvertebrates at 23 out of 30 sites. electroshocking began in early Fish August and we have a total of 12 sites in the

watershed scheduled to be sampled. Full speed ahead in Little Raccoon Creek. Construction on both the Middleton Run Reclamation and Lake Morrow projects began in August. Both projects are located in Jackson County near Wellston. The Middleton Run project is a surface mine

reclamation project. Lake Morrow is being drained and a dam consisting of coal spoil will be modified and a culvert installed to keep water from collecting behind the dam. It sure has been a busy summer. Over and out.

You Guys Ever Seen a Mink?

A brief encounter with this critter within our watershed led me to educate myself and others about it. Resident of every county state-wide, the American mink is a staple of the Ohio wildlife enthusiast's viewing diet. The American mink is a constituent of the Mustelidae family, which identifies it as a carnivorous mammal amongst the ranks of otters, badgers and wolverines. Illusive, territorial, beady eyed and invariably found near water (due to its semiaguatic disposition) the



mink is a member of the Raccoon Creek Watershed. They sport a dark brown and notably luxurious fur with short legs, webbing between their toes and an elongate body. Historically prized for the pelt and the struggle required for the trapper to catch the creature, they must travel lightly in their natural habitat. Carnivorous in nature, the American mink feeds on sentient creatures ranging from rodents to crustaceans to many avian species. Now that you know a little more, seeing one may be even more exciting!


